

Local candidates in spring election can now circulate papers

Candidates seeking to run for elected offices in the city and town of Port Washington and the Port Washington-Saukville School District could begin circulating nomination papers Dec. 1.

The spring election will be held April 2.

In the City of Port Washington, there will be elections for the 1st, 3rd, 5th and 7th District aldermanic seats that are currently held by Mike Ehrlich, Jim Vollmar, Joe Dean and Dan Becker, respectively.

A full slate of town officials are up for election in spring, including Town Chairman Jim Melichar, supervisors Mike Didier and Jim Rychtik, Clerk Jennifer Schlenvogt and Treasurer Mary Sampont.

The city and town officials are elected to two-year terms.

Candidates for these seats must submit their nomination papers to their respective clerks by 5 p.m. Wednesday, Jan. 2.

In the Port Washington-Saukville School District, three seats are up for election in April.

They are currently held by Jim Eden, who represents those portions of the towns of Grafton and Saukville in the school district, and Kelly O'Connell-Perket and Jim Olson, who represent the City of Port Washington.



School Board terms are for three years.

School Board candidates must file a campaign registration statement and declaration of candidacy at the School District office, 100 W. Monroe St., Port Washington, by 5 p.m. Jan. 2.

If more than two candidates seek any one seat, a primary election will be held Feb. 19 to narrow the field for the April 2 election.
